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

# The Mask of DISHONESTY

Deception usually starts innocently but becomes habitual and progressive. -

*Mark Reynolds*

- A. Lying is one of the oldest sins, and is still a problem today.
1. "The Day America Told the Truth" (James Patterson & Peter Kim): 91% of Americans lie regularly; 63% men and 52% women have lied to protect themselves.
  2. Temptation for Christians as well (Eph. 4:25; Phil. 4:8).
- B. What is lying? "Conscious and intentional falsehood" (Thayer).  
"To deceive, or attempt to deceive, by a lie" (Moulton).
1. A lie is a false statement deliberately presented as being true; something meant to deceive.
  2. "Whatever is NOT what it professes to be is a lie" (Thayer).
- C. Lying is often difficult to identify, which makes it dangerous.
1. False impressions created to deceive (Gen. 12, 20).
  2. Self-Righteousness (Matt. 23:27-28).
  3. Doctrines of men (Rom. 1:25).      4. Self-Deception (Gal. 6:3).
1. \_\_\_\_\_ Impressions Meant to Deceive (Gen. 12, 20)
- A. Abraham told Pharaoh and Abimelech that Sarah was his sister so they would not kill him and take her. It was "half true" because she truly was his half-sister (Gen. 20:12).
  - B. He intentionally left out vital information so as to deceive.
2. \_\_\_\_\_-Righteousness (Matt. 23:27-28)
- A. This type of lie is told not only by words, but also in the way we falsely portray ourselves to others (meant to deceive).
  - B. It is impossible to commit a sin when no one is looking.
  - C. Faithful Christians cannot help you get to heaven if you keep lying to them!
3. Doctrines of \_\_\_\_\_ (Rom. 1:25).
- A. If you want to find a man-made teaching that will seemingly justify your sins, it will be easy to do.
  - B. Evolution, Once saved always saved, Universalism, etc...
4. \_\_\_\_\_-Deception (Gal. 6:3)
- A. Whereas self-righteousness is lying (in word and/or deed) to deceive others; self-deception is lying to deceive yourself.
  - B. All of the above sins end with the same result (Rev. 21:8); however, self-deception is by far the most dangerous!



## Conclusion:

- A. Take off the mask of dishonesty!
- B. It is never convenient to stop committing a sin we enjoy, but it is always right!

Jesus shares His last sermon with the people of Israel. What would He say? What platitudes and marks of honor would He share with them? A serious study of this text reveals His uncompromising stand for truth and righteous living—from the inside out. Jesus could not and did not imitate false spiritual leaders and neither should the faithful child of God. # The Mask of IMMORALITY

Genesis 38 - How you present yourself sends a message. Immorality comes with consequences. -Eric Lyons

1. Introduction
  - A. Background: Explaining the relationship between Judah, his three sons (Er, \_\_\_\_\_, and Shelah), and \_\_\_\_\_
  - B. The custom of \_\_\_\_\_ marriage
  - C. Tamar and Judah's sin
    1. And did you notice the \_\_\_\_\_ standard?
    2. Judah seemed more worried about being viewed as cheap than being known for being with a harlot.
2. Lessons Learned from Genesis 38
  - A. Modesty Matters!
    1. Depending on her dress, Tamar could clearly be identified as a widow or a \_\_\_\_\_ (38:14-15,19). How you present yourself sends a \_\_\_\_\_!
    2. In Eden, Adam and Eve went from being completely naked, to being \_\_\_\_\_ naked, to be \_\_\_\_\_ clothed (Genesis 3:6-11,21).
    3. God desires for His children to be modest (1 Tim. 2:8-10; 1 Pet. 3:1-5).
  - B. Sexual Immorality is Sinful (Regardless of What Culture Says!)
    1. Judah had married a \_\_\_\_\_ (38:1), and it is very likely that his daughter-in-law (Tamar) was also a Canaanite.
      - a. As far back as the time of \_\_\_\_\_ (Gen. 15:13-16) down to the time of Moses and Joshua (Lev. 18:3,21-25), the Canaanites were well-known for their \_\_\_\_\_ wickedness and immorality.
      - b. What Judah and Tamar did was despicable despite what Canaanite culture thought about it.
    2. Regardless of what the world says, \_\_\_\_\_ is not merely "having an affair, and two unmarried people fulfilling lustful desires are not "making love"—they are committing sexual \_\_\_\_\_ and are \_\_\_\_\_ against God (1 Cor. 6:9-11; Gal. 5:19-21; Eph. 5:5; cf. Isa. 5:20).
  - C. Sin Comes with Consequences
    1. Judah didn't keep his \_\_\_\_\_, while both Judah and Tamar committed sexual immorality.
    2. Sin causes spiritual separation from God. It can also cause emotional suffering, unplanned pregnancy, diseases, etc.
    3. Sometimes standing **against** sin will also bring about suffering (e.g., Joseph), but in the end the suffering of the \_\_\_\_\_ will lead to blessings beyond measure. (Heb. 11:24-26).

# The Mask of Prejudice

Galatians 2:11-14 - Prejudice and discrimination is still alive and well and the only way to defeat it is to exposé it and replace it with love and equality. -

*Mark Reynolds*

- A. Dictionary.com defines Prejudice as: (1) an unfavorable opinion or feeling formed beforehand or without knowledge, thought, or reason; (2) any preconceived opinion or feeling, either favorable or unfavorable; (3) unreasonable feelings, opinions, or attitudes, especially of a hostile nature, regarding a racial, religious, or national group.
- B. Prejudice is certainly not a new thing, nor has it ever been easy to avoid, even among God's people.

## I. Peter's \_\_\_\_\_ of the Gentiles (Acts 10, 11).

- A. Peter's eyes and heart had been opened by the vision God showed him (Acts 10:34, "Then Peter opened his mouth and said: 'In truth I perceive that God shows no partiality.'")
  - 1. Peter's prior prejudice was based on a false belief that Israel was God's favorite nation whose souls God valued most, which seems to be the prevailing belief of the time.
  - 2. "God shows no partiality" was a bold statement.
- B. Another occasion Peter had joined with Paul to answer those who seemed to be saying, "We will accept the Gentiles as long as they become just like us" when the question of circumcision came up.
  - 1. Acts 15:6-12 - again the detractors were silenced!
  - 2. Paul spoke after Peter and informed those at the meeting that God had worked miracles and wonders among the Gentiles (Acts 15:12).

## 2. Peter's \_\_\_\_\_ of the Gentiles (Galatians 2).

- A. Another occasion Peter put on the mask of hypocrisy. (Gal. 2:11-13)
  - 1. He was afraid of what the Jews would think of him hanging out with Gentiles.
  - 2. Even worse he led others to be hypocrites by his actions.
- B. As a brother in Christ Paul corrected Peter face to face (Gal. 2:11, 14). He rebuked Peter before them all, exposing him as a hypocrite.
- C. Hypocrisy always has consequences.

## 3. Peter \_\_\_\_\_ with His Sin

- A. Peter showed humility in his rebuke by Paul.
  - 1. He did not hold a grudge against Paul, but rather lifted him up in Scripture (2 Peter 3:15-16).
  - 2. In fact he talked about the wisdom given to Paul through inspiration.
- B. Peter must have been grateful to Paul for helping him overcome a sin that would have cost him his soul.

## Conclusion:

- A. "There is neither Jew nor Greek, there is neither slave nor free, there is neither male nor female; for you are all one in Christ Jesus" (Gal. 3:28).
- B. If our speech says one thing, but our actions say another are we any better than what Peter did to the Gentiles?

# The Mask of SILENCE

Esther - Christians are living in an ever increasing sinful tolerant society, and it is past time we stopped hiding our faith and take a stand against the evils in our time. - *Brandon Britton*

Introduction:

- A. How did something as horrible as the holocaust ever happen? How could over 6 million Jews be rounded up and executed? One word: SILENCE
- B. Martin Niemoller was a Protestant Pastor who became an outspoken opponent of Hitler and spent seven years in a concentration camp, and something he wrote explains it all clearly:  
First they came for the Socialists, and I did not speak out Because I was not a Socialist. Then they came for the Trade Unionists, and I did not speak out--Because I was not a Trade Unionist. Then they came for the Jews, and I did not speak out--Because I was not a Jew. Then they came for me--and there was no one left to speak for me.
- C. A similar holocaust almost happened roughly 2,300 years earlier, but it was stopped because one person decided not to remain silent.



1. **Sometimes Speaking Up Comes With A \_\_\_\_\_ (Esther 1:1-2:4)**
- A. Queen Vashti could have remained silent and remained queen, but she stood up and said no, though it cost her the crown.
- B. There may be situations in life where we have the right to remain silent, but we must ask ourselves if it is right to remain silent.
2. **Sometimes Silence Is \_\_\_\_\_ (Esther 3:1-4:14)**
- A. Queen Esther feared that speaking out would result in her execution.
- B. Her Uncle Mordecai warned her that remaining silent would result in all of their extinction.
- C. Esther proceeded to speak up because it was the right thing to do, despite the fact that she did not know if it was going to cost her, her life.

Conclusion:

- A. How did the holocaust of the 1930-40's happen? Silence.
- B. How was the holocaust of Esther's day avoided? Breaking the silence.
- C. Today we are in the midst of a spiritual holocaust as untold numbers enter, not a gas chamber, but eternal torment.
- D. The greatest cause of this spiritual holocaust, silence, the

# The Mask of DISGUISE

2 Corinthians 11 - Satan will never show his real face. Satan will appear in whatever form you want him. He is a liar, murderer, deceiver, roaring lion, and even appears as an angel of light. - *Mark Reynolds*

- A. Ancient Job had everything he needed in life, and most of what he wanted when it came to physical things.
  - B. However, a conversation was taking place that would change Job's life and challenge his faith.
    - 1. Satan had boasted to God that he had gone throughout the earth, insinuating that he had been met with no hindrance to his work and will, and found no one to oppose his actions.
    - 2. God reminded him that there was at least one place where Satan had no foothold, and that was in the house of Job.
    - 3. The question by God was: **"Have you considered my servant Job?"** (Job 1:8) - Yes Satan had considered Job.
  - C. "And no wonder! For Satan himself transforms himself into an angel of light" (2 Cor. 11:14).
    - 1. The worst part is that Satan convinces many "Christians" to also live in the dark while professing to be a child of light.
    - 2. Rather than imitating Jesus they imitate Satan himself.
1. **He \_\_\_\_\_ everyone is just as evil as he is (Job 1:10-11).**
- A. Evil dictators always assume everyone around them is just as evil.
  - B. He deceives many would-be Christians to think the same.
    - 1. "Everybody's doing it."
    - 2. "Nobody can be that positive all the time;" "Only nerds act like that."
  - C. Satan gets us to act just like him!
2. **He \_\_\_\_\_ people they have no good in themselves (Job 4:7; 2:9)**
- A. Like purchasing a used car Satan points out only the bad in our lives and keeps our flaws ever before us to convince us we are cheap.
  - B. Rather than being reminded of our value by remembering the price paid to redeem us, many use Satan's tricks on others.
3. **He will appear in whatever \_\_\_\_\_ YOU desire.**
- A. When Satan considers God's people he notices all the objects of our affections.
  - B. Along with the temptation Satan will provide a way to "take advantage" of that temptation.
  - C. He will mask this opportunity as pleasurable, enjoyable and desirable.
  - D. Both God and Satan are pulling for you, but you cast the final vote!

## CONCLUSION

- A. The good news is that you can withstand the devil!
  - 1. True in the case of Job and other great Bible characters.
  - 2. Bible tells us about the times some of our heroes gave into temptation, but also tells of their triumphs!
- B. Life is too short and eternity is too long to be fooled by Satan in a mask.




